RE: Condensate stripper restart

Dear Mr. Mallett:

New-Indy has requested to restart the stripper. The US EPA and BAQ believe the use of the stripper may reduce the odors from the plant. Therefore, the Bureau will allow the restart of the stripper while an application is prepared and submitted for a permanent restart so as to not delay a potential solution to the odors.

The information you provided indicates the process generates about 800 gallons per minute of condensate and the stripper can only handle 400 – 450 gallons/min. New-Indy will split the streams and send condensate to the stripper and the remaining condensate the stripper cannot handle will be sent by the hard pipe to the aeration stabilization basin in the wastewater treatment system. Please notify the Bureau when the facility has completed restarting the stripper.
